All Children attending School will receive a Souvenir Book and Beaker. Mr. C. S. Read, Cinema Proprietor, of Malton, is also kindly presenting to the same children a Coronation Medal. Children below school age and those born during Coronation year will receive a Beaker. In the case of the latter the Beaker will be handed to the Parent of the child by the Registrar of Births at Malton at the time of the registration of the birth of the child.

A peal of bells from St. Leonard's Church will be rung intermittently between the hours of 10 a.m. to 11 a.m., 2 p.m. to 3 p.m. and 8 p.m. to 9 p.m.

The Malton White Star Band, under the conductorship of Mr. R. Warcup, will play at intervals between the hours of 3 p.m. to 8 p.m. during the Sports and Carnival Parade.

On Thursday, 20th May, all people of 65 years of age and over, the Blind and disabled unemployable Ex-servicemen, will be entertained to tea at the Pioneer Club. A Souvenir will be presented to every person attending the function.

As a permanent commemoration of the Coronation trees will be planted in suitable positions in the town and inscribed seats fixed in the Market Place.
